# HOME-SCHOOL PARTNERSHIP

#### 1. Read for Life

As the school holidays are approaching, we would like to encourage our students to cultivate the good habit of reading during the holidays. As part of our efforts to support this, we would like our students to read at least two books from both English and Mother Tongue Languages during this December holidays.

# 2. Sale of School Textbooks and Uniforms during the School Holidays

Your child has received the booklist and details on book purchase this week. Online sales of the school uniform has commenced from 1 November 2025 and on-site uniform sales at the school will begin on 5 December 2025.

You may refer to the PG letter "Updates on 2025 End of Year Sales of School Uniform, School Textbooks and Registration for School Bus Service" dated 30 October 2025 for details on the end of year uniform sales and the online ordering guide. We encourage you to make your purchases early.

#### 3. Dental Clinic Services

The school dental clinic is open on certain days during the year-end school holidays. If your child/ward requires urgent dental treatment, please call and make an appointment with the dental clinic at 87641706.

#### 4. Joint Advisories for Students

For the upcoming year-end school holidays, Singapore Police Force (SPF), Central Narcotics Bureau (CNB), National Crime Prevention Council (NCPC) and National Council Against Drug Abuse (NCADA) have jointly provided an advisory to remind students to stay away from crime and drug/inhalant abuse. The advisory alerts students to the dangers of online scams and advises them on how to protect themselves from becoming victims of crime.

The Police would like to alert members of the public to be vigilant against scams perpetuated via emails that impersonate educational institutions. Since 14 October 2025, there were at least 15 cases reported, with total losses amounting to at least \$44,000. In this scam variant, the victims would receive emails requesting urgent payment of outstanding school or tuition fees. These emails were sent from email accounts belonging to fellow students which have been taken over by the scammers or email domains that are very similar to the official email accounts of education institutions. To make payment, the victims were asked to transfer money to a bank account. The victims were warned that the failure to do so quickly would subject them to actions by the school's litigation department. The victims would realise that they had been scammed after seeking verifications from their school, or after receiving relevant alerts and anti-scam advisories.

MOE would like to advise members of the public to exercise caution when receiving emails requesting for school fees through direct payment, immediate bank transfers, or payment links outside official student portals. Please check with the relevant institutions via official channels before transferring any fees, especially for unscheduled payment requests.

Health Promotion Board (HPB) and Health Sciences Authority (HSA) have also jointly provided an advisory to remind parents and students that vaping is illegal, regardless of age, and that vaping is harmful and can be a gateway to cigarette smoking. The advisory also provides information on the Tobacco Act and the penalties imposed on the offences. We encourage you to share with your child/ward the information in Annex B.

#### 5. Students' Use of Mobile Phones and Smart Watches in School

Students are <u>not allowed</u> to bring their mobile phones and smart watches to school to minimise distractions during school hours.

Should there be a need for students to bring mobile phones/smart watches to school, parents must apply and request permission through our HOD Student Management and permission will be granted based on the merit of each application. Information on this application procedure will be shared in the 1st Keeping in Touch Letter at the start of 2026 Term 1.

We would like to highlight that should permission be granted, students are not to use mobile phones/smart watches during school hours, including recess, CCA and after-school programmes (e.g. supplementary/enrichment/remedial lessons).

Students are required to put mobile phones/smart watches in their classroom lockers only. Students are expected to buy a lock to keep their locker secure. After school ends, students can retrieve their mobile phones/smart watches from their lockers and are allowed to contact their parents/guardians at the waiting area beside Gate 1 or Gate 3 just before they leave the school premises. Students should bear full responsibility for safekeeping of their mobile phones/smart watches. The school will not be responsible for the loss or damage of their devices.

We would like to assure parents/guardians that there is no need for students to have access to mobile phones/smart watches while in school. If students need to reach their parents/guardians for urgent matters, and vice versa, they should contact the staff at the General Office for help.
